Message from Mr. Robson:

Hopefully you are well aware of the campaign being led by West Sussex schools to persuade the Government to provide additional funding for education in the County. You will have seen letters that I have sent home explaining that West Sussex Head teachers do not understand why your

children should be 'Worth Less' than children in other areas of the county, and you may also have seen and heard coverage of the campaign in the local media.

On Tuesday this week I joined 11 other Head teachers, 5 West Sussex MP's and pupils from schools across the county in travelling to Downing Street to hand a letter to Theresa May requesting an urgent decision on school funding in West Sussex. You may have caught more media coverage on the radio, television and newspapers.

In common with every other West Sussex school, our funding this year is very tight, but there are no planned redundancies and we are confident that the quality of our provision will not be adversely affected. Limited predictions for next year are that once again, we should be ok. But beyond that it is impossible to say, and in the meantime, if you have any opportunity to sign the online petition:

https://petition.parliament.uk/petitions/167761 or write to your MP (asking for assurance) it can only help to raise awareness in Government circles.

I can reassure you that my staff and I will do everything possible to ensure that we continue to provide a high quality service to you and your children, and I will keep you informed of any significant developments. The Hidden Disability Programme at Gatwick Airport



The airport can be a scary place for someone with autism, it's busy, with way too many people not looking where they're going, only seeing things from their level. Then there are the noise levels, the lights, the smells, the selfishness of everyone else travelling, the waiting, the QUEUES! And then the flight itself. It's an autistic nightmare.

Thankfully due to a lot of hard work by some amazing people there is now a lifeline - The Hidden Disability Assistance Programme. Maria Cook, Chair of Autism Support Crawley and OCS (Outsourced Client Solutions) have been working together to put together a programme to support families and lone travellers with a hidden disability through Gatwick.

There is a dedicated email address - <u>Hidden.Disabilities.at.Gatwick@ocs.co.uk</u> - which gives you access to a team of wonderful people who will then set up a bespoke service depending on the requirements of the person/family travelling as it's not just those with autism that this scheme will help, there are many hidden disabilities that need considering such as dementia, hearing loss and anaphylaxis to name just a few.

Those wanting help are also then sent a green lanyard with sunflowers on in the post for them to wear on the day of travel. This very subtle marker highlights to airport staff that the person in question needs extra support, perhaps extra time to process information and to prepare to go through security.

The future for accessible air travel is very bright indeed thanks to the dedicated team at Gatwick Airport. Don't forget to contact them next time you are planning a holiday flying out of Gatwick.

Dance for a Special Generation

Through this project, 60 children in six special schools across West Sussex will benefit from working with an internationally renowned, inclusive dance group, Stopgap Dance Company. The project takes place in the Spring term. We are looking forward to working with choreographer at StopGap, Chris Pavia (pictured below). Chris became an apprentice at StopGap in 1999 and became a fulltime dancer with the company in 2000. He is proud to be chosen by Mencap as someone with Downs Syndrome achieving excellence in his career and we are excited to share this inspirational story with our whole student population at Manor Green College and our parents and friends.

The project will involve 3DPr and 3MJ participating in a programme of dance workshops led by Stopgap which will develop the children's knowledge, skills, and confidence. Staff will also be able to take on new skills which they can apply not only in the performing arts but also across the whole curriculum. The progress that each school makes will be recognised through the award of Arts Mark accreditation validated by the Arts Council. Individual children will also be able to gain Arts Council accredited Arts Awards.
