DANCE FOR A SPECIAL GENERATION

With the support of Sussex Arts Academy, six West Sussex schools, Manor Green College being one of them, have been successful in their bid for £15,000 to run an exciting programme to promote the arts across the curriculum for a group of around 60 children with special educational needs. The initiative is supported with investment from Artswork, the South East Bridge, acting on behalf of the Arts Council England.

The project is run in partnership with the internationally renowned Stopgap Dance Company who are leading a programme of intensive dance workshops in each of the schools, starting here at the college on the 27th February and continuing until the end of March. The company has been at the forefront of inclusive dance both as a professional touring company and a charitable organisation keen to nurture the next generation of disabled dancers. With exceptional experience of initiating integration between disabled and non-disabled dancers, Stopgap is committed to sharing its knowledge as widely as possible.

Nicky Norton, Community Dance Development Officer with Stopgap, said, "We are very excited to be embarking on this ambitious project and working with all the young people taking part".


"The workshops will develop the children's knowledge, skills, and confidence," says Lesley Dyer, Headteacher at the Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee School in Horsham. "Teachers will also be able to take on new skills which they can apply not only in the performing arts but also across the whole curriculum. The progress that each school makes will be recognised through the award of Arts Mark accreditation validated by the Arts Council. Individual children will also be able to gain Arts Council accredited Arts Awards".

The workshops will be evaluated by the Heather Green, Senior Lecturer in Special Education at the Chichester University Institute of Education, and the results will be made available to schools across the region and the country as a whole.

The Hidden Disability Programme



A recent survey by the National Autistic Society highlighted 75% of parents in the UK feel most isolated in supermarkets due to lack of understanding and sensory discomforts.
