National Centre for Excellence in the Teaching of Mathematics

Teaching for Mastery at Manor Green College



It's an exciting year for Maths at Manor Green. We are in our first year developing a Teaching for Mastery approach in Maths.

This means encouraging students, wherever appropriate, to broaden and deepen their understanding of mathematical concepts rather than moving on quickly to the next step. This, in conjunction with an increased focus on developing skills rather than just knowledge, will ensure our students are best prepared for the next part of their journey in life, whether that's moving into Key Stage 4, into FE, on to one of our local colleges or into the workplace.





As a college, we are developing links with other SEND providers in West Sussex, collaborating with seven other SEND colleges and primary schools to develop a county-wide approach to Maths Teaching and Learning supported by the NCETM and the Sussex Maths Hub. This is the first collaboration of alternative provision providers with a Maths focus in the whole country, which is very exciting for the college.

We look forward to sharing with you our progress over the course of this journey!





Our DofE has been growing in popularity each year. We now have thirty one students on roll working towards completing their awards. This year we have nine students on Bronze and nine students on Silver expeditions. Seven students are working towards their Gold award and we are hoping to have an expedition set for them in the Summer of 2021. We already have three youngsters signed up for the Bronze Award for the Summer of 2021.





In the Summer term the Bronze expedition will be on the South Downs Way and we have two Silver expeditions, one on the Bath to Bristol Railway track and another on the Jurassic coast.

Over the last two terms, classes in Key Stage 3 have been taking part in some exciting music lessons with Adam and Jack. The classes have taken part in a variety of workshops including drumming, singing and a beatboxing class with one of the best beatboxers in the country!!! Adam and Jack (music teachers) have been really impressed with what they have seen. "We have run some really inclusive sessions to make sure everybody got the opportunity to have a good experience. We used professional recording equipment, various instruments and looked to build confidence in the students. The students have been fantastic with some really developing throughout the unit of work. There is some real natural talent at Manor Green."

Moving forward, there will be an assembly next half term to celebrate the musical talents of Manor Green College!!





With British Science week only a few weeks away (6th to 15th March 2020) we thought this would a good time to share some of the fantastic work that our students have been doing in their Science lessons.

Year 8/9 modular students have been learning about Animal Classification. Having learned about the photography work and insect portraits by Levon Biss, they were inspired to create their own 'enormous insects' drawings. Students all chose a small section of a regular picture of an insect, and used their observation and creativity skills to transfer it to a much larger piece of paper. Their work was then pieced together to create an overall image. Haven't they done a fantastic job!



KS4 students have been busy completing coursework as part of a 2 year AQA Entry Level qualification. Their topic this term has been 'Elements, Compounds and Mixtures', and recent lessons have focussed on how to separate different types of mixtures. In these pictures you can see some students using paper chromatography to separate the colours in a black felt tip, and other students separating the iron from a breakfast cereal. Both activities can easily be done at home - ask your young scientist to explain their methods! We were all impressed by their enthusiasm and efforts in these lessons.









We will be celebrating Science week just after half term; we hope that your children will enjoy the activities that we have planned for them.





4HH and 4KZ Cycling for Independence

Students have been developing their Life Skills by taking part in a series of off-site bike rides. First they practiced on the playground and then they took to the cycle paths of Crawley!

So far they have cycled to the supermarket and to the BMX track at Cherry Lane. Another trip is planned to Tilgate Park. Staff have been supported throughout by Sustrans, a Nationwide Charity which champions and encourages sustainable transport.

This half term has particularly been very busy for our students in the High Needs Group. After the Christmas break, it took a while for most of our students to get back into their routines however when they did, they took to their scheduled activities like they had never been away.

This term started off with the whole class missing one of our students. Sachith had been in our High Needs Group since year seven and his last day at Manor Green College was the 20th December 2019. Sachith was in our post 16 group, in year 12.

He has moved on to a different provision. We shall all miss him and wish him the best in whatever he does.

5SM

One of the biggest areas in which the students in 5SM have excelled has been in their community inclusive activities. Our weekly programme involves students engaging in life skills including shopping at various local supermarkets, travel training within the community, using leisure facilities like swimming pools in the community and accessing the Sensory Room at Langley Green. In all these activities, students are being prepared to live in their communities as equal citizens with a visible presence.

Through our Community Inclusive activities, we are also educating the general public to the plight of our students who present with some very complex learning difficulties and disabilities. It is our sincere belief that our students deserve as much respect, opportunities and life outcomes as everyone else. Below is a sample of some of the activities our students have been engaged in.









A visit to the local surgery to help alleviate some of Annabelle's anxieties with regards to any routine GP appointments, following the labyrinth at Wakehurst Place, a very well-known therapeutic intervention for people on the spectrum. Archie shopping at a local supermarket. Josh pretending to be a Wallaby at Tilgate Park.



The Hydro Therapy Pool is a favourite for our students who need constant sensory modulation. Cooking, riding trikes and Forest Schools are some of the other skills based and sensory modulating activities that our students enjoy.



The students have been to the local Library for sensory stories. Many thanks to Crawley Library for organising these sessions, our students gain invaluable skills by being in such public spaces and having such enjoyable and educational experiences from different people within the Library.









Each week some students from 3AC practice their Lifeskills to help develop their ability to cope with and learn to manage other environments out of school. They make a shopping list and take it to Sainsbury's to practice the skills involved in purchasing goods. They learn how to find the items on their list then practice their money skills at the till to pay for their items.



PMLD

Students in PMLD have been studying a sensory version of Alice in Wonderland and are currently on chapter 7. All the students showed great skills in Anticipation, Response, Awareness, Persistence and Initiation. They all have to be commended for always waiting for their turn to have a go. It is not always easy for our students to wait; it is a skill that we teach our students with great success!

Personal Development - Daisy King - 3SU

Over the last half term Daisy has really started to show what she can do. Daisy has started to challenge herself and opt for the spicy or flaming hot option in her Maths sessions. She is also starting to listen more and participate far more in her lessons.
