## Message from Mr. Robson

It has been an absolute joy to watch the KS3 students practice and perform their stage production of The Jungle Book.

Every class has been involved and every student has taken part, and despite missing a dress rehearsal due to Tuesday's closure (for which I thank you for your patience and understanding in helping us at short notice) they still confidently produced two performances on the Wednesday.

Drama is an important and developing part of our curriculum offer, and despite money being tight, we have managed to raise sufficient funds to convert a classroom into a dedicated drama studio. Drama helps to give students the confidence to cope under pressure, and if you accept that in general, life is a performance, it enables our students to learn to perform in social situations—nervous on the inside, but confident on the outside—not unlike the rest of us.

Our Key Stage productions offer our students the opportunity to take part in complex social situations, no matter what their difficulties and differences. As I was discussing with a parent on Wednesday, their complete acceptance of their peers and their support and encouragement for each other, helping to overcome their difficulties is a lesson for all.

Lewis was great at getting hold of the ball then passing it to the team.
