Students develop a wide variety of skills from research to leadership skills. Creative skills to presenting skills. Our Dance project with partners Stopgap Dance Company, Artswork and Sussex Arts Academy has concluded with a super assembly from 3MJ and 3DPr. We shared dance videos from Stopgap and information about our guest dancers, Laura and Chris, both full time professional dancers with physical or learning disability. Laura is in a wheelchair and was a lead choreographer at the opening ceremony of the London 2012 Paralympics. Chris is the first learning disabled choreographer in the UK to have his work toured. We also showed video of our workshops and then presented in front of Key Stage 3 and 4 our dance piece. Having our young people fully engage and coordinating their bodies, listening and anticipating the movements was a great achievement and we are very proud of them all.
