Dear Parents/ Carers,

I hope you are all doing as well as can be during this challenging time. The changes to routines and everyone's way of life take some time to adjust to. Staff teams have been sending work and activities home to support with time at home. This is only appropriate if you feel it will work for your family. These are suggested activities and are completely optional. The most important thing is that you are all fit and well and that takes precedence over everything. When we return to college staff teams will work with families and students to cover any areas that have been missed. Staff will also be in contact via email, Dojo, email and phone.

FSM Easter	Last week we successfully delivered FSM lunches to families who indicated they required them. This week a parcel for a week will be delivered by the staff team. This system will be reviewed at the end of the week. There will be provision for us to look after our students over Easter. This is
Lastei	prioritised for the <u>families of key workers first</u> and then those <u>we have agreed with social care</u> that should have support. Information about that will be sent out separately. <u>This should still only be used if it is not possible to have the child at home</u> . This will minimise the risk to your child and staff at the college.
Exams	As you know the government has cancelled all exams for all general qualifications, i.e. GCSEs, A levels etc. We have written to all our students affected by this to let them know what is happening regarding the GCSE exams they would have been sitting. Although there were no exams, this also affects Entry level qualifications. Currently the awarding bodies are working hard with regulators and the government to make sure young people who were due to take our exams this summer get the qualifications they deserve.
	Associations representing teachers, schools and colleges are also involved and are helping create a process that's fair for everyone affected. Ofqual expects to publish detailed information about the process for Entry Levels, GCSEs, AS and A-levels in the week leading up to the Easter holidays. This will include the steps for teachers to follow and detailed guidance on how to consider the full range of evidence available when submitting grades. By Easter, Ofqual will also outline the process for making sure grades are fair across schools and colleges, as well as their proposals for appeals.
	Please rest assured we have your son/daughter's best interests at heart and we will
