I have been copied into some brilliant emails that some of you have sent to our local MP's as part of the funding campaign. I know that public sector funding is a hot potato at the moment

but as my letter indicated there is local difficulty with funding for West Sussex schools, and especially West Sussex Special schools. Our MP's should be making more of a fuss about West Sussex school funding so that it is at least raised to a fair level compared to other similar Local Authorities. I should also say just to reassure you, the College is currently managing financially and will be for some while, but the Government have said there will be no increase in the funding settlement for West Sussex for the next 3 years and I'm making 2% cuts per year to cover cost rises. If we don't act now we will have a problem down the road so if you haven't yet forwarded the template letter on to your MP please do so.

On a separate note, in assembly today, I will be letting the students know that I am leaving at the end of the summer. Many of them know already but since there might be some students who will be sorry to see me go, it might be possible that 1 or 2 might get upset so please be aware just in case. Mr Tom Smith, will start in September, and they are going to really like their new Head teacher, as I'm sure will you.

CUTTING 40CM OFF MY HAIR!


Hi, my name is Eleanor. Last year my stepdad, Benn was in a car crash and the air ambulance helped to get him out of the car and treat him. Unfortunately Benn died from his injuries 13 days later, on my 13th birthday.

We were all devastated, but are so thankful to the air ambulance as they kept him alive and gave us all the chance to say goodbye. Without them we may not have had the chance. I loved him so much and miss him more than he would ever believe. I have always had long hair so chopping it all off is quite a big deal for me. I have severe anxiety disorder so it isn't a decision I have taken lightly. But seeing a young girl who had lost her hair to cancer my mum and I talked about the wigs that can be made, and I wanted to help. Plus I think as Benn had no hair this is a fitting tribute to him! So I am going to be cutting at least 40cm off of my hair and donating it to the little princess trust to Make wigs for little girls who have cancer.


